2. **Upon a call of the roll**, the following Committee members attendance was recorded as follows:

3. **Approving Civic Affairs, Cemetery, Traffic & Lights Committee prior month meeting minutes.** Alderpersons Kowalski moved/Wolfe seconded and all concurred, to **approve, as presented**, the Civic Affairs, Cemetery, Traffic & Lights Committee regular meeting minutes from 11/21/2022.
4. **Request for permit to park on City tree lawn.** Alderperson Kowalski moved/Wolfe seconded and all concurred to recommend the Common Council approve the request from Noel Forgette of 1449 Sherman Street for a permit to park one (1) vehicle ('96 Chevrolet van) on the tree lawn due to an unnecessary hardship.

Review/Approval Criteria for Pedestrian Caution Signs Request on Lincoln Street and Pine Beach Road.

1. No specific recommendation from the police department. The addition of pedestrian caution signs on Lincoln Street and Pine Beach Road does not hinder police operations.
2. Records show 1 accidents/crash reported at intersection of Pine Beach Road/Shore Drive since 2020.
3. **Traffic Control signs already in place: Stop sign on north side on Lincoln Street at Pine Beach Road. Stop sign on Chautauqua Road at Pine Beach Road.**
4. No vision obstructions observed at the intersection.
5. Traffic surveys performed in half-hour deployments at Pine Beach Road at Lincoln Street showed:
 - A range of 4 cars per half hour to 35 cars per half hour. The 4-car count was on one occasion being Sunday evening between 9:00 pm and 9:30 pm. The high traffic count of 35 was on a Wednesday afternoon between 2:30 pm and 3:00 pm. This heavier traffic flow may coincide with shift change at the Luther Home. The average vehicle traffic per half hour was 6 vehicles. Two pedestrians were observed walking during these traffic surveys.
 - Speeds ranged from a low of 20 mph to a high of 32 mph observed.

Law Enforcement does believe that the time of the year and weather conditions were a factor in the low pedestrian traffic observed during the traffic survey.

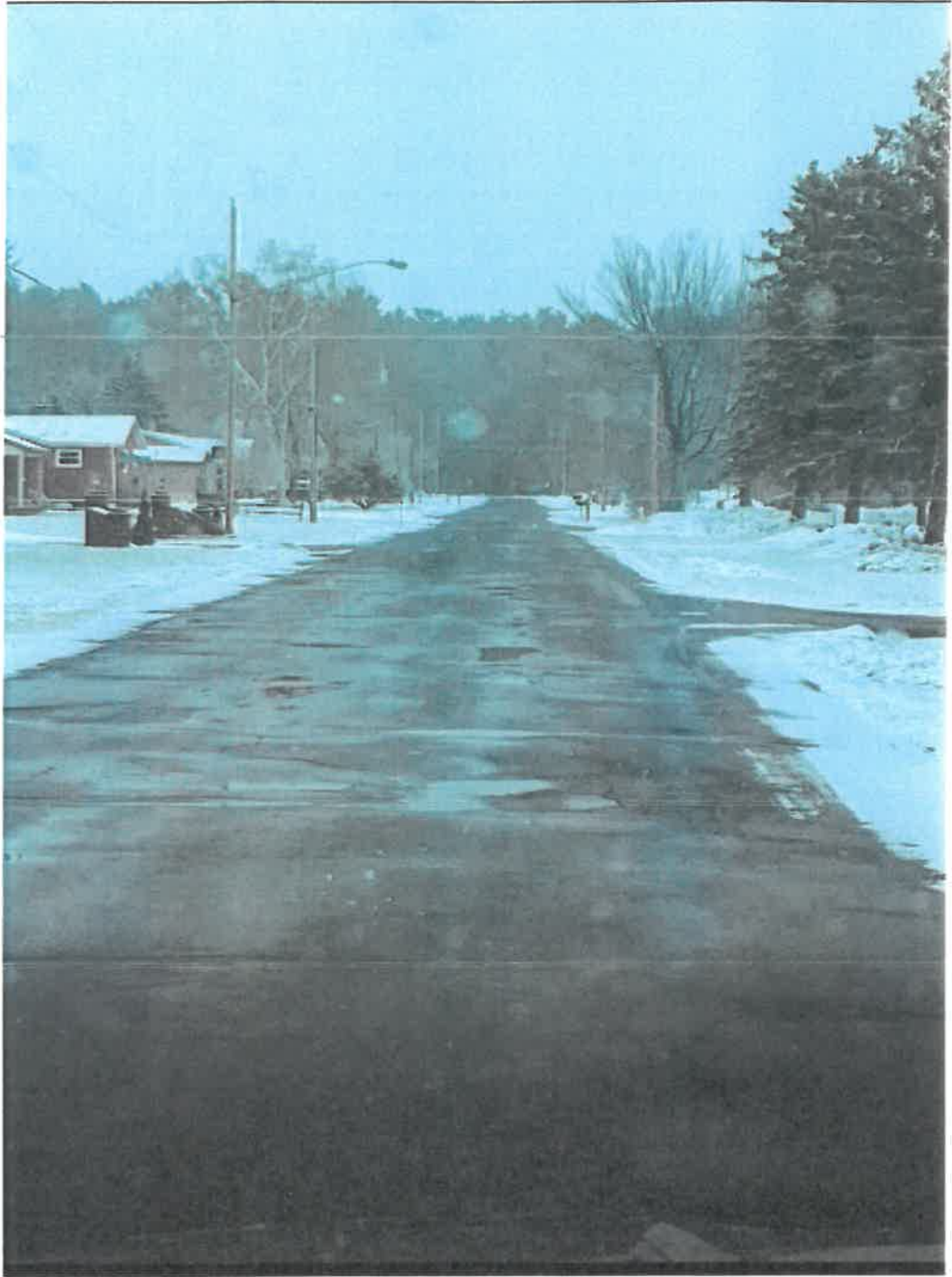
- No traffic stops were conducted during the 7 traffic surveys.
- Traffic surveys were performed during the time frame of 7:45 am to 11:30 pm.
- Outside of the traffic surveys relative to this report, in the last three years there have been one accident on the road way which occurred on Pine Beach Road at Shore Drive. Other crash reports were taken; however, they were parking lot related (Luther Home Parking Lot). Over the last three years total of five traffic stops, a citizen assist, and one law enforcement response to the area for a person who fell. All the traffic stops were at the intersection of Shore Drive at Pine Beach Road.

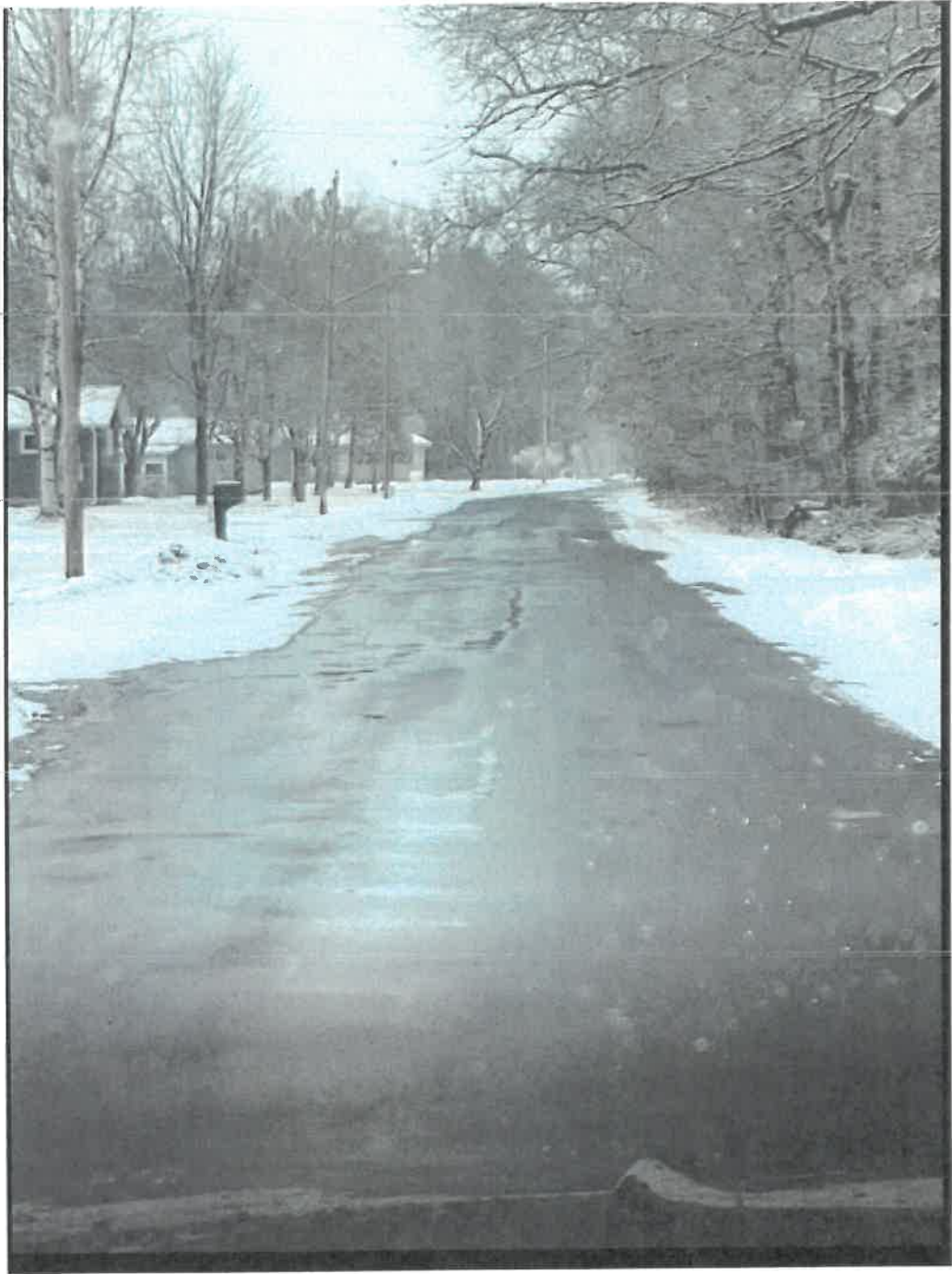
6. Street appears in very good condition

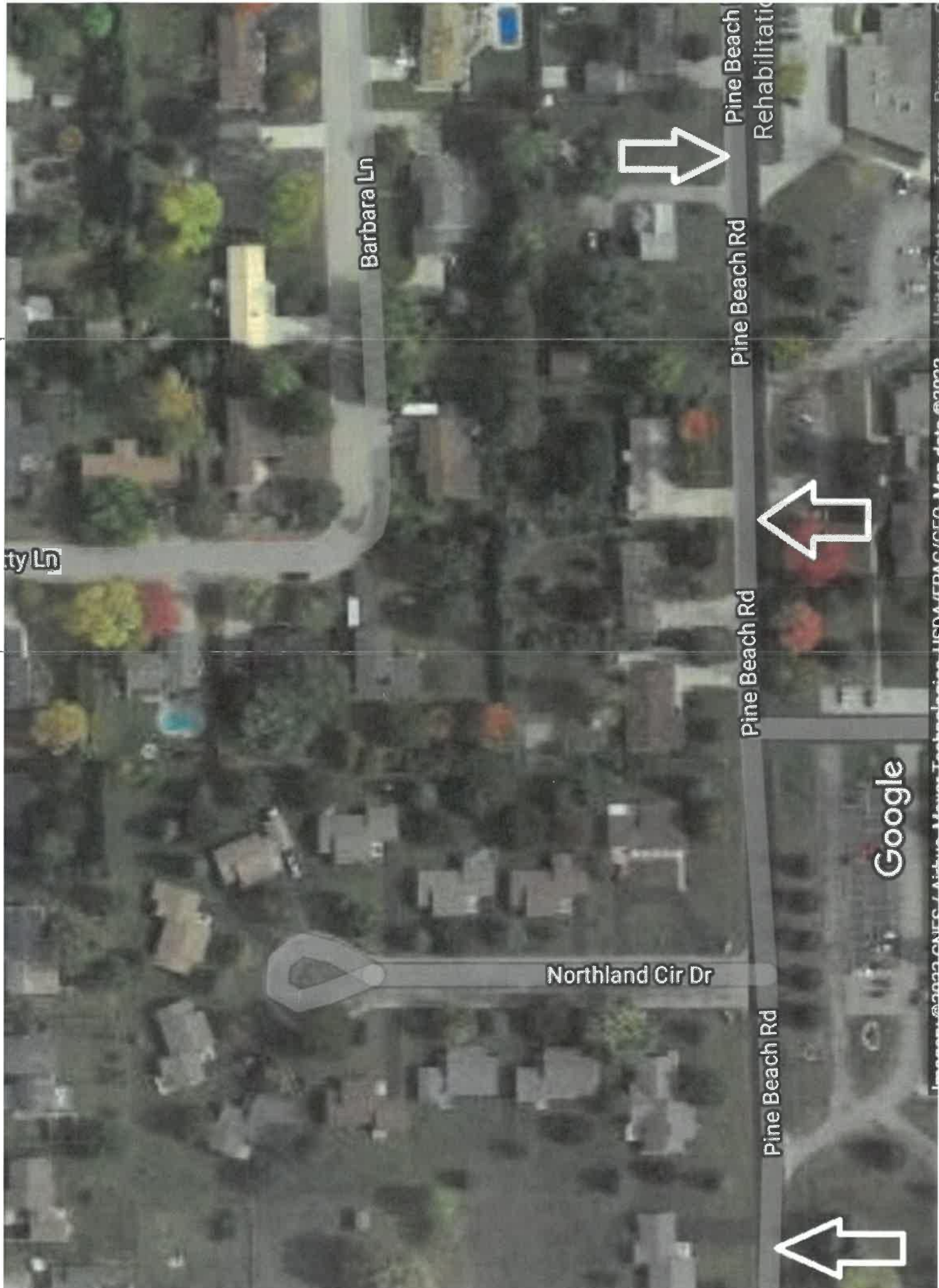
